

# Paper Formatting Instructions for UKCI-03

## Abstract

The “Abstract” title must be centered 12 point bold type, with 12 points space before and after. The Abstract text should be indented 0.5cm on both the left and right hand margins. Use 10 point type, with a vertical spacing of 12 points. Between 8 and 16 lines would be appropriate.

## 1 Introduction

Papers must print on A4 paper with all margins 2.5 cm. The main text must be in two columns of 7.6 cm justified left and right. Times or Times-Roman typeface should be used throughout. A maximum of eight pages is allowed.

The paper title should be 16 point bold type, with a vertical spacing of 24 points before and after. The author’s names are then centered in columns. The main author is to be listed first (left-most), and the co-authors’ names (if of different address) are set to follow. Include email addresses for each author.

For the main text, use 10 point type with a vertical spacing of 12 points. There should be no additional space between paragraphs. The first line of each paragraph should be indented by 0.5cm, except for the first paragraph of each section.

Figures, tables, and their captions can be arranged in whatever way the authors believe looks best, but nothing may extend into the 2.5 cm margins.

There should be no page numbers – these will be added when the complete proceedings is printed.

## 2 First-Level Headings

All headings should be in title case (initial capitals) and flush left. First-level headings are 12 point bold with 12 points space before and after.

### 2.1 Second-Level Headings

Second-level headings are 11 point bold with 11

points space before and after.

#### 2.1.1 Third-Level Headings

Third-level headings are 10 point bold with 10 points space before and after. Further levels of headings should not be required in such a short paper.

## 3 Reference Style

Citation of references can follow any style that the authors are used to, as long as it is consistent throughout the paper, e.g. Bullinaria (2002). The reference list style used below is preferred.

## Acknowledgements

All acknowledgements go at the end of the paper, just before the references. Use an unnumbered first level heading.
